AYP (Annual Yearly Progress) standards as established in the No Child Left Behind Law. Congratulations to BHS students and staff for this accomplishment.

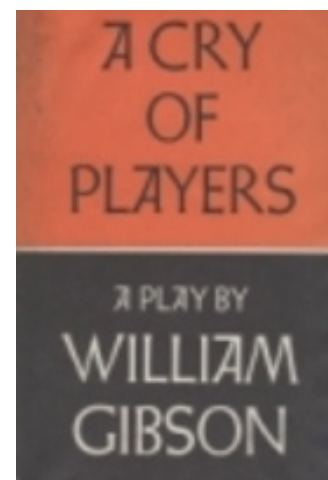

REMINDER -- PRACTICE SAT EXAM (PSAT) at BURLINGAME HIGH SCHOOL



The PSAT/NMSQT (Preliminary Scholastic Aptitude Test/National Merit Scholarship Qualifying Test) is designed for juniors but sophomores are encouraged to take the exam. The exam is offered only in October. Test duration is two hours, ten minutes. The PSAT gives the student an opportunity to become aware of the types of questions that they will confront on the SAT. The October

17, 2009 exam will have the same critical reading, math and writing skill questions found on the new SAT. Junior scores from the test will also be used to determine the candidates for the National Merit Scholarships. Score reports will be distributed at school in mid-December 2009.
